CLOSING ADDRESS

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Before coming to a close of this conference, I wish to inform you that the International Organizing Committee discussed the question of the next conference in a meeting that took place on August 20. The committee was unanimous in recommending that a further conference should be held again in three years as the field of cyclotrons and their applications shows no signs of becoming less active and interesting. The committee took the following decisions: The Eighth International Conference on Cyclotrons and their Applications is to be held in USA in August or September 1978. If the organizational problems can be satisfactorily solved, it shall be held in Bloomington, Indiana; if not, in Gatlinburg, organized by Oak Ridge National Laboratory.
