LaTeX Installation, Michel Goossens, CERN (15')

People around the world need to install LaTeX at institutes and conferences so that authors can produce PS files with only postscript fonts.

How does a LaTeX system work?

They have at least two options:

PS versions of Computer Modern (CMR) (Bluesky or equivalent, etc.)

Times + CMR in PS as above

Present a recipe: How does one install the system so that one gets the options above.

Recommended platforms, operating systems....

What goes wrong with them, e.g. fonts, people cheating (margins). Re-make failures because of different macros. Different installations, LaTeX on Mac with TeXtures. Figures: remaking them in PS, bounding boxes... Does Acrobat 4 help? Do we need tochange the templates?

WORD Prepared Documents, Yong Ho Chin, KEK (20')

What goes wrong with them, as above, but also when 3 pages go to 4, cross-platform problems, cross-versions, Asian and Cyrillic font problems. Should we make the templates more sophisticated e.g. auto-numbering of sections, figures, references and so on.
